Love and Logic Parenting Workshop

Ellen Thomas and I are facilitating the second Love & Logic parenting course.

The second workshop, for parents of children 7 years old to teenagers, will began on evening of February 2 from 7:00pm - 9:00pm. Sessions will proceed on the following Thursday evenings: February 9, 16, 23, March 1, 8, and 15.

Love and Logic is a discipline program designed to help teach parents those skills that will enable their child to learn responsibility, make choices, and face consequences. Parents think, react, and deal with children in a loving and logical manner. When a child is given a task, makes their own choices, and fails, the consequences for their decision are given with love and empathy from parents. The child is required to think about and deal with consequences of their behavior.

Love and Logic "uses humor, hope, and empathy to build up the adult/child relationship, emphasizes respect and dignity for both children and adults, provides real limits in a loving way, [and] teaches consequences and healthy decision-making".

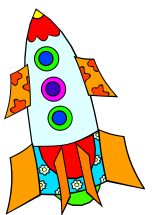
Jules Verne

the books written by Verne and the details he included. His two most famous novels are described. See which novels were made into movies.

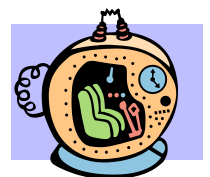


Time Travel: Science Fact or Science Fiction?

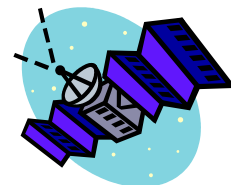
Science Fiction -Science Fact

Parents think, react, and deal with children in a loving and logical manner. When a child is given a task, makes their own choices, and fails, the consequences for their decision are given with love and empathy from parents. The child is required to think about and deal with consequences of their behavior.

Love and Logic "uses humor, hope, and empathy to build up the adult/child relationship, emphasizes respect and dignity for both children and adults, provides real limits in a loving way, [and] teaches consequences and healthy decision-making".

M'KIS Counselors Elizabeth Daley and Ellen Thomas are facilitating two Love & Logic parenting courses.

The five (5) session early childhood course is designed for parents whose children are under age six (6). It will be offered during the month of January from 7:00pm to 9:00pm in the Activities Room, one floor below the Theater. The dates are **Thursday, January 12; Tuesday, January 17; Thursday, January 19; Thursday, January 26; and Tuesday, January 31**. There will be a charge of RM 40 for a personal Parent Workbook.

The second course is designed for parents whose children are ages seven (7) through teens. It is seven (7) sessions long and will be offered starting on Thursday, February 2 from 7:00pm to 9:00pm.
